

Please note that your child's classroom assignment is tentative until new enrolments or withdrawals are completed during this time frame. If your child's placement or classroom teacher changes, you will be notified. Only those students affected by reorganization will be moved. We ask for your continued support and cooperation.

MEET THE TEACHER NIGHT & BBQ

STORAGE AND ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION

Parents are responsible for ensuring that all medication and forms are updated annually for any student who requires medication to be administered at school. If your child requires medication, please have the necessary forms completed and return them, along with any medication, to the office as soon as possible.

MEDICAL ALERT-ANAPHYLACTIC SHOCK-NUT ALLERGIES

Please be aware that there are students in our school with a severe life-threatening food allergy (anaphylaxis) to all TREE NUTs, PEANUTs and **SESAME**. This is a medical condition that causes a severe reaction to certain allergens and can result in death within minutes. Although this may or may not affect your child's class directly, please send lunches and snacks to school with your children that are free from peanuts or nut products. We ask that you do not send in food products for the whole class to celebrate birthdays or social occasions. A donation of a book or game to the classroom is a safe alternative to food products and will be enjoyed so much longer by the children. Please feel free to contact your child's teacher if you have any concerns or questions. We thank you for your co-operation and pa day attention to this health

SCHOOL AGENDAS

School agendas have been ordered for children in FDK



to Gr 8 to assist your child in organizing his/her time. The teachers will be reviewing the importance of the agenda with their students. Your child is responsible to record their homework, upcoming projects/assignments, important dates, and teacher notices in their agenda. We are asking that you check your child's agenda on a daily basis to keep informed.

CUSTODY OF CHILDREN

On rare occasions, we are faced with difficult situations in which non-custodial parents arrive at school asking to visit their child or to take their child home after school. We are best able to serve and protect students when we are made aware of legal custody arrangements, visitation rights and other special instructions. If legal custody matters affect your family, please ensure that our office and classroom teachers are aware of any custodial arrangements that may affect your child during school hours.



FIRE DRILLS/LOCK DOWN PROCEDURES

We are required to conduct three fire drills in the fall and three in the spring. We are also required to practice two lock down drills during the year and one Shelter in Place. Lock down drills involves students moving away from the classroom door to a location within the classroom away from windows. Lights are turned off and the doors are locked. These practices are to ensure that students and staff are prepared in case we should need to go into lock down. Lock down would be initiated by police and Board security personnel.

TEXTBOOK POLICY

Textbooks are the property of the school and are loaned out to students with the expectation that they will be returned at the end of the school year in good condition. The teachers keep a record of each textbook that students are given. Please help to keep our costs down by encouraging your child to take proper care of them. There will be a replacement cost to the student if the textbook is damaged, lost or not returned at the end of the school year.

STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

The Board takes every precaution to provide a safe learning environment for students, but accidents can and do happen. Some families have private accident insurance which can respond to costs arising from injuries. However, many families do not.

As required by the Education Act and the Ministry of Education, the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board annually provides parents with information about cost-effective student accident insurance coverage via your child. Although enrollment is voluntary, the board strongly encourages parents to take advantage of the inexpensive insurance coverage, especially if their child/children participate in sports,

excursions/field trips, or, if parents do not have dental insurance coverage.

Parents alone have the right to insure their children. An <u>acknowledgment form(GF401)</u> was sent home. It <u>must be signed and returned</u> to the school to ensure an awareness that the board doe not provide insurance and that you have received the insurance brochure. It is a requirement for the participation in Gym classes, excursions and/or extra-curricular activities.

PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES AT JHN23

Bringing your own electronic device is now recommended for learning.

The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board acknowledges the value of the use of technology for learning. Students are permitted to register and use personal electronic devices on board premises and/or board sanctioned events for educational purposes, under the direction of staff and only with parent/guardian permission. Students are required to adhere to the student "Personal Electronic Device Used with WI-FI Network Student Agreement" (GF 337) and the "Network User Application and Agreement".



Please be advised that the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board will not be responsible for any cost incurred through the use of personal data plans.

Devices are to be used responsibly and should not interfere with learning; their use must comply with the Catholic Code of Conduct, board policies and procedures. Any personal communications (i.e., phone calls, text messages, etc.) will continue to be directed through the main office. Failure to comply with these guidelines may result in a loss of PED privileges and/or any other consequences deemed necessary by school administration.

The school principal may authorize limited acceptable uses of personal electronic devices during school-sanctioned activities for a specific designated purpose outside of instructional spaces and/or in common areas.

Students are responsible for the safety and security of PEDs at all times and the Board assumes no responsibility for lost, damaged or stolen devices. PEDs may be used only with permission from a staff member.

Students need to be diligent about safely storing their PEDs. St John XXIII School is not responsible for lost, stolen and/or damaged PEDs

Students are to keep their personal information private (e.g., age, address, phone numbers, usernames, passwords).

Students are to use good judgment in accessing material on the internet, and report concerns. The Catholic Code of Conduct and academic integrity apply to the use of technology when students are accessing information. It is the student's, and/or parent/guardian's, responsibility to address normal and reasonable security measures such as maintaining anti-virus

protection and security patches for software for the protection of those sharing the wireless network. Students should not expect privacy with respect to any of their activities when using the board's wireless network and agree to and accept that access and/or wireless network activity may be monitored in order to identify usage patterns, security issues, etc. Photos, videos or images of an individual/group are not permitted to be taken without expressed consent. No school and/or board data can be stored on a PED. Inappropriate use of board technology and/or PEDs may result in confiscation of the PED, discipline, suspension or termination of these services, or police involvement.

- COVID-19 vaccines for children 6 months to under 5 years and booster doses for student 5-18 years of age
